Fire prevention week topics

Your ability to get out of a home during a fire depends on early warning from smoke alarms and advance planning.The National Fire Protection Association \(NFPA\) is a global nonprofit organization, established in 1896, devoted to eliminating death, injury, property, and economic loss due to fire, electrical, and related hazards.Since 1922, the NFPA has sponsored the public observance of Fire Prevention Week. Make this a community-wide event — invite residents to team up singing the song. Electrical Keep lamps, light fixtures, and light bulbs away from anything that can burn, such as lamp shades, bedding, curtains, and clothing. Fire Prevention Week \(FPW\) is an annual observance aimed at educating the public about fire safety. You may have as little as two minutes \(or even less time\) to safely escape a home fire from the time the smoke alarm sounds. Let them understand that their drawings should look like you are giving a fire signal. Have these graphics in your children’s safety books. Write a letter to the editor of your local newspaper promoting the importance of fire prevention. Sparky.org offers children’s activities, videos and games. Additionally, Bouch suggested partnering with other first responder organizations to provide public safety resources. If families make a plan and never practice, they aren’t really safe; this activity can help! 3. Let them understand that it is not the time to panic and do nothing. “When we think about the volunteer fire departments, we often say, ‘well, you know, they don’t have money,’ but they also don’t always have time and dedicated staff,” Vastis said. Make a statement around your community with the official Fire Prevention Week logo and poster. Also consider contacting local media to cover Fire Prevention Week, bringing attention to not only the life safety messages but also your department’s work to keep the community safe. Have a neighborhood home hazards hunt. You can find everything from apps to videos to printables and much more, to make sure your workers have the resources they need to keep their family and community safe.Here are some great ideas of ways your organization can participate in Fire Safety Week this year:Host a family fire safety event or send home kid-friendly activities with employees. This week also encourages workplaces to review their fire safety plans and other safety procedures to assess if they are still usable for possible incidents. NFPA offers teaching tools for educators and parents to use with children, which include lesson plans, tip sheets and Sparky the Fire Dog videos. The panel discussion featured Michael McLeier of the Michigan State Firemen’s Association, Andrea Vastis of the NFPA, and Bruce Bouch of the U.S. Fire Administration, offering resources fire departments can use, many of which are free, to aid their FPW efforts. “We are able to offer things like tip sheets, lesson plans, social media assets, and curricula and community toolkits that are done - that are ready.” Vastis added that if Fire Prevention Week is a department’s sole fire prevention effort for the year, it is a great opportunity to widen public awareness of your department and of prevention information for the community. Ensure that the firefighter is assisted in making the class lively. Install Choosing the Right Smoke Alarm and Sensors: Select from various types, including battery-operated, hardwired, and combination smoke and carbon monoxide alarms. Or, use the questions at a community event; matching local officials against each other in a fire-safety challenge. Talking smoke alarms have been found to be more effective with sleeping children. Videotape the performances and show them on your local cable access channel, at a Fire Prevention Week talent show, or a community movie night. Learn more: \[Graham NC Fire Department Enhance your lesson plans by having the kids sit in a circle, tell the first kid where to meet when there’s a fire, and let him whisper the spot to the next kid, etc. Hang the official FPW banner outside your fire station. Alternatively, they could trace this equipment in a craft book and write them down. For optimal performance, mount alarms on ceilings or high on walls \\(within 12 inches of the ceiling\\) since smoke rises. Use the trivia questions from NFPA’s Remembering When™: A Fire and Falls Prevention Program for older adults on a local radio show. This proactive approach ensures that alarms remain operational. Residents completing the quiz can return it to the fire department, city/town hall or at a fire safety exhibit held at a fall festival. If you have more than one banner, other good locations are town/city hall, hospitals, schools, busy intersections or a mall. There are many ways to use these resources to reach the community - social media, websites, events or outdoor signs. It has been celebrated since 1922 in commemoration of the Great Chicago Fire of 1871. Let one kid press the fire button \\(which could be a bell\\) as an alarm and shout fire. Mark drilling points at least 8 inches from walls and follow manufacturer instructions for proper installation. These virtual activities should be structured based on the children’s ages; they can have fun learning. Make this a progressive party with appetizers at one home, burgers at the next and dessert at the final home. Instead, let them roleplay calling 911. 4. The week encourages individuals and families to take proactive measures to protect themselves and their homes from fire hazards. Hand out smoke alarms, night lights, oven mitts or safety brochures. Placement Guidelines: Install smoke alarms on every level and room of your home and workplace, ideally at least 10 feet away from any cooking equipment to reduce the chances of false alarms. In 2024, it will take place from October 6 to October 12 with the theme “Smoke alarms: Make them work for you!”, which emphasizes the importance of having functional smoke alarms in homes to prevent fire-related fatalities. When one sounds, they all sound. Fire Prevention Week is the longest running public health and safety observance on record. In 1925, President Calvin Coolidge proclaimed Fire Prevention Week a national observance, making it the longest-running public health observance in our country. Let’s get back to community-wide activities that are fun and give residents a sense of pride while learning about fire safety. Fire Prevention Week 2024 – Smoke Alarms: Make Them Work For You! This year’s campaign strives to educate everyone about the importance of having working smoke alarms in the home. Bus depots and billboards are a great place to get the message out. Replace Battery Maintenance: Change batteries twice a year, even if alarms are not beeping. Station ideas include sound the smoke alarm, get low and go under smoke; and firefighters — wear funny stuff.
