## Cartman slave song lyrics

There's no slave song or work song out there with those specific lyrics. And another thing, there's only one version of Swing Low, which was written by a Choctaw Indian guy named Wallis (I think his first name was John). The song is actually a spiritual, it's about waiting for the rapture and escaping slavery through the underground railroad. The only thing those two songs have in common is that they both hope things will get better. The lyrics you're thinking of are from Swing Low Sweet Chariot, which goes like this: Swing low, sweet chariot Coming for to carry me home Swing low, sweet chariot Coming for to carry me home I looked over Jordan, and what did I see Coming for to carry me home? A band of angels coming after me, Coming for to carry me home. Chorus Sometimes I'm up, and sometimes I'm down, (Coming for to carry me home) But still my soul feels heavenly bound. (Coming for to carry me home) Chorus The brightest day that I can say, (Coming for to carry me home) When Jesus washed my sins away. (Coming for to carry me home) Chorus If you get there before I do, (Coming for to carry me home) Tell all my friends I'm coming there too. (Coming for to carry me home) Can someone identify which episode of South Park features Cartman singing a song with lyrics like "du du du du duh, master got me workin'"? It's been driving me crazy. The song starts with something like "Slave's never finished, master's got me working, someday master set me free" and is from the Mecha-Streisand episode, which is near the end of the first series. (Note: I kept the original text in English as it was.) You don't have permission to delete messages in this group due to anonymous email addresses or lack of view member email addresses permission. Cyberwolf discusses a song, questioning the lyrics "been around the world," which don't make sense. However, another user corrects this, suggesting the actual song is "Swing Low Sweet Chariot," a version with mostly chorus lines repeated, and notes that finding original lyrics might be challenging due to some disagreeable content. A musician counters, stating "Swing Low Sweet Chariot" is not fictitious but written by a Choctaw Indian named Wallis, and its lyrics are about longing for the rapture and escaping slavery via the underground railroad, with no inherently disagreeable content unless interpreted through a biased lens. The actual lyrics of "Swing Low Sweet Chariot" are provided to clarify the song's meaning and dispel confusion. If someone gets there before I do, tell my friends I'm coming too. If you're already there, then let them know I'm on my way. On October 1st, 1998 at 2:00 AM UTC-5, Eric Christophersen asked the group: "Which episode of South Park features Cartman singing that song? It goes something like 'du du du du duh, master got me workin'. It's killing me." He was later joined by others who shared similar concerns and questions. However, in 2000, South Park released an episode that tackled this very issue. The episode, titled "Tom's Funky Fantasy," features Cartman singing the song Eric loved so much - the song from the musical "Mecha-Streisand."
