You can only have sex with 3 different women total. Does romancing Keira affect other romances? The good news is that if Geralt chooses to romance the sorceress Keira Metz, it won't have any impact on his relationship with Yennefer or Triss. Keira is the first romantic interest in the game and before Geralt can romance her, he needs to complete several quests for her. How many romance options are there in Witcher 3? The Witcher 3 romance options Broadly speaking, we can divide them into three categories: primary romances (Yennefer and Triss), secondary romances (all other named and significant characters), and tertiary romances (those who are being paid for it). Who is the first romance in Witcher 3? Keira Metz Keira is likely the first romance you'll have in The Witcher 3 if you choose to pursue her. Here's what you need to do to make it happen: When you finish the "Wandering in the Dark" main story quest in Velen, Kiera will ask you to go and see her. Does Yennefer get pregnant? Image: CD Projekt RedRevisiting CD Projekt Red's 2007 PC game The Witcher today, one of the most awkward components is its collectible romance cards.These are a collection of cards that you can earn throughout the game for sleeping with different romanceable NPCs and often depict several of its female characters nude or close to it. The cards have become somewhat of a divisive topic among the game's community today, with some seeing them as an example of the way that video games used to relish objectifying women during the 2000s, while others simply view them as a clumsy, albeit harmless attempt, at building upon the existing romance mechanics in the game.With the original Witcher receiving a new remake, courtesy of the Polish studio Fool's Theory, there's no better time to reflect on this odd piece of the series's history. And in order to do this, we reached out to Karol Kowalczyk, a story designer and scripter on The Witcher 1, who was among those responsible for designing these cards. He was able to shed some light on how the cards ended up in the game and gave us some input on what he would change, given the chance to revisit them today.Kowalczyk joined the Witcher development team in 2004 after working on a Polish MUD called Arkadia, which was also based on the works of Sapkowski. According to him, the cards were a fairly late addition to the game and they weren't added to be an erotic collectible, but because the team didn't actually have enough resources to create animations for some of the romantic encounters in the game.These are the censored versions of the cards that appeared in the original North American release images: CD Projekt RedThe Witcher team had wanted Geralt to be faithful to his counterpart in the novels and this meant giving players the opportunity to lean into his more promiscuous side. Players could therefore complete quests to sleep with a list of NPCs in the game's world, including various humans, dryads, and elves. Barely any of these actually received much more than a single flirtatious line of dialogue, with the card meant to act as an explanation of what had transpired and a memento of this relationship.As he explains to us, "It's pretty common knowledge [in the industry] that it's very easy for animators to create a scene when a huge portal opens and several dragons rush in and cause destruction around the city. But if you want two characters kissing - oh boy - that can take weeks and still feel cringy or cause laughs instead of creating a romantic atmosphere."The Witcher team had hoped these cards would be an appropriate stand-in, but since the games release, they have been subject to criticism online for their objectification of the game's female characters.The journalist Aimee Hart reflected on the mechanic in an article for EGM in 2020.While The Witcher 3 does some excellent characterization with characters like Triss, Yennefer, and Ciri by allowing them to be fleshed out women instead of women who are closely linked to Geralt, the series started off on a particularly bad foot by gamifying sleeping with women by letting Geralt collect sexcards of the women he has conquered. Its since become a notorious mechanic and one that thankfully does not make a reappearance in the third game.The writer Lauren Morton, meanwhile, was a bit more forgiving in her retrospective for PC Gamer. She did acknowledge that it reduced the female characters to objects, but couldn't deny the satisfaction she experienced from trying to collect them all:For my part, it's hard not to turn these romance cards into a game of gotta catch 'em all. They may reduce every woman in the game to a novelty item but as a player I can't deny how, just like every other kind of collectible, I immensely enjoy digging through a wiki to make sure I'm doing each quest properly. I don't want to miss one.Speaking to Kowalczyk today, he maintains that the problem with the mechanic stems from the team simply getting carried away with adding them and failing to consider how the player would react to them. As a result, something that he argues began life as a potentially meaningful sonnet of Geralt's relationships in the game became shallow and collectible.Watch on YouTube Subscribe to Time Extension on YouTube2.8kIt is about the fact that you switch to a mindset that you need to collect them all, right?" he tells Time Extension. "And in that context, it is indeed very disturbing that the game kind of forces you to become a mindless sex addict to get some of those. We failed to see that as when you are testing the game for the 100th time, you start to do it mechanically and don't really feel those emotions."Online there have been a number of conversations among fans about whether the new remake will include these cards, and whether they can be fixed. Some, for example, have jokingly suggested that Geralt should be able to sleep with different sexes or be able to receive male cards as well, but Kowalczyk has another potential solution."With the experience I have now, I'd leave the drawings in the game, but remove "any" suggestions that this is a collectible, and also do a review of all the scenes and strip the game of those that were causing mixed feelings."He believes this would go a long way to changing how people react to this aspect of the game, keeping it much closer to its original intention. It should be noted, however, that Kowalczyk no longer works at CD Projekt, and therefore has no say in whether they will appear in the upcoming remake.CD Projekt hasn't shied away from the card's controversial status in the past. The Witcher 3: The Wild Hunt - Blood and Wine, for instance, features a tongue-in-cheek reference to the cards activated by talking to a local courtesan. Perhaps Fool's Theory can think of an equally clever way to pay tribute to the original game, without simply repeating the mistakes of the past. The purpose of this guide is to maximize your chances for romantic encounters in The Witcher. All romantic encounters are listed here along with the method of obtaining them. Romance cards represent these encounters. You should be able to collect all the cards except three on any given playthrough, one of those being either Shani's or Triss' second card and the other two being two of the three Chapter V romance cards; at any rate, you can obtain one card for each woman who has one before Chapter V. If it is your intent to collect them all, then it would be a good idea to read through the whole guide for each chapter as soon as you begin that chapter, and then focus on it as much as possible to the exclusion of the main quest. This focus can be done concurrently with a focus on gathering money and/or leveling up; the main key is to not rush through to the end of each chapter or the end of the game. Prologue[Triss Merigold[]Make time for her, after giving her the Potion for Triss. The main thing to remember is not to rush her back to the other witchers after giving her the potion. Chapter I[]Vesna Hood[]Rescue her from bandits, then walk her home, then schedule a late-night rendezvous at the old mill. Bring wine. If you forget the wine, you'll have to come back with it the next night. Be careful as she can be killed while walking her home.Peasant woman[]A peasant woman in a yellow and green dress provides a tryst in return for tulips. One other thing making her unique is that she usually comments on Geralt's weapons as he runs by: "Quite the dangerous one...". If spoken to after the encounter she will make a short comment about how "delightful" it was and that she wish to see Geralt again. The easiest way to obtain the tulip is on a corpse along the nearby road to the southern cave entrance, possibly her previous "flower lover" (who suddenly disappeared). A celandine plant grows next to the corpse. Abigail[]An opportunity will present itself near the end of the chapter, while in the cave that leads from the Salamandra hideout. Be sure to get the other Chapter I romance cards before getting to this point, as there will be no way to do so afterwards. Chapter II[]Shani[]After you do an autopsy on the corpse, you must speak with Shani again before opening the tower, or you will miss out on this Card. After Dandelion's party, give her a red rose.Moreen[]During the quest A Lost Lamb, after giving her a wolf pelt, the proper response to her question about romance without procreation will unlock her romance card. This card can be obtained until the end of Chapter III.The Gossip[]The way to get this card is either give red women's gloves or a diamond to the Gossip who is walking around the Temple Quarter. She tends to stay around Roper Street, Hospital Street and the run from Peddler street to the gate to the dike. This might take several stabs at the conversation as she is easily distracted.Half-elf Woman[]After Geralt saves her in A Ghost Story, he can speak with her to get her card. She can be found in a house almost exactly opposite Vivaldi's place, across a small barrier -you can enter this part of the green light district from the St. Lebioda's Hospital side. Skillful choices in the conversation should lead to "I don't know what that means, but I know what you will say next" line. This card can be obtained until the end of Chapter III.Prostitutes[]There are a few ways to get this card. You can pay 250 orens to a prostitute; You can give a silver ring to a prostitute; you can complete the Working Girls quest and refuse reward, then give a flower (not an alchemical ingredient) to a prostitute in lieu of payment; or you can complete Working Girls, accept the cash reward, and get a discount on a prostitute's services (110 orens instead of 250). All the prostitutes share the same romance card; this doesn't include courtesans in Chapter III. Supporting the Squirrels at the bank in Chapter III will cause all the prostitutes in the temple quarter to inform you that they "refuse to consort with elf-lovers". But the Harbor Whore at the Dike either hasn't heard about the bank or doesn't care, the card can be obtained from her. Chapter III[]Triss or Shani, second romance card (mutually exclusive)[]During the quest "The Source", you must choose to whom Dandelion should take Alvin. You can obtain the second romance card with the woman you chose to watch over Alvin, the one you didn't choose will be unavailable.Triss[]You must offer a gift of a ruby ring, and in speaking with Alvin, you must be strict with him at least once. Her second romance card is unlockable afterwards.Shani[]Shani wants a gift of a silver amber ring. When interacting with Alvin, you should indulge him (e.g., by giving him a sweet when requested).Princess Adda[]During the quest "A Posh Reception," dialogue options will lead to a task for Geralt to obtain some raw meat (Catoblepas Meat which you must have Triss conjure up after you learn of it from Velerad and Thaler) for her to eat. Adda will invite Geralt to her alcove for a cutscene and a romantic encounter. During the cutscene, before the romantic encounter (the display of the romance card), you see Geralt's amulet hit the floor and vibrate furiously.Blue Eyes/Courtesans (not to be confused with Prostitutes from Chapter II) []Bring the Blue-eyed lass a gold sapphire ring, a sapphire, 500 orens, or 300 orens by presenting the House of the Night signet ring. She can be found on the ground floor in the House of the Queen of the Night.Queen of the Night[]Get upstairs by bribing the guard with some Fisstech, boxing him, or showing him the House of the Night signet ring. You'll need to talk with the queen once, then back to Patrick de Weyze, then back to the queen. Agree to spare the queen's life once, and experience a foursome with three of her sisters, who are types of vampires known as an alp. The romance card depicts a single vampire. Curiously, the cutscene prior to the romance card shows one of the sisters turning into a bruxa instead of an alp.Noblewoman[]There are two mutually exclusive noblewomen with whom Geralt can have sex; both have the same romance card. The first is a woman in a vermilion dress (over a white chemise, with purple trim on her headdress), found near the jester on John Natalis Square. She wants you to prove your manliness, either by presenting her with a kikkimore claw or by offering her an insultingly low fee (0 works). After the sex, if spoken to, she comments "A witcher in bed cures my boredom". The other option is a (possibly drunk) woman in white, near the town hall, who uses a "missing" silk scarf to start a conversation with the witcher.Rozalind Pankiera[]This romance card is available during the quest Dandelion's Lute. If you meet her before you receive the quest from Dandelion, you will have missed out on this card.Town Clerk[]To obtain this romance card, you should visit the upper floor of the City hall armed with a diamond. Seek out a clerk willing to be a "naughty girl" and turn on the famous witcher charm. Chapter IV[]Celina[]Be sure to speak with Celina before speaking with her sister Alina, and to have a ring in your inventory; you will not get a second chance at this romance card if you don't have a ring with you in order to get it the first time around. Any ring will fit the bill, despite her saying it must be better than her sister's ring. She may also be found in her home at the village.Lady of the Lake[]In order to get the romance card Geralt must first talk with the Lady of the Lake about why her "host in shining armor" is gone; she tells that they went on a mission to search the Holy Grail and directs Geralt to the Hermit in the Fields who know more about this. Then Geralt must talk to the Hermit and ask him of the Holy Grail, a dialogue option which only now will be available, and exhaust all options; then a new one will appear about asking the hermit what the Lady of the Lake feels about this Holy Grails mission. Geralt asks that too. Failing to do this will result in the romance option being unavailable. The third step is to return to the Lady and tell her that he wishes to embark on "a mission". She will get her hackles up and stop him right there (having only just told him that she takes a dim view of grail quests). Now Geralt has to decide if he calls this just "a jest" or if he insists on the mission.Jest: the automatic dialogue leads to the sex card. She gets around to the fact that it is lonely being a goddess and while she is fully aware that her subjects may lust for her, they would never dare act on those feelings. She tells the witcher that he should compliment her, so he does, in a fairly lame manner, which she is quick to point out. Finally he gets an inspiration and decides to compliment her ass, saying it puts others to shame. This amuses her greatly and they finally get to know each other better. After the sex a new dialogue option will be available "Why the Fisher King?" - not very clear, but probably meaning that Geralt wonders why the old man has been her lover once. The question irritates the Lady and she reprimands Geralt, seeing the question as an indicator of typical male claim of ownership over women. She jests about Geralt mediocre qualities "in the bedroom" but then takes it back saying "it was not so bad". Geralt takes his leave in a humble mood...Mission: If he persists with the quest "of paramount importance" conversation, and it does initially sound noble, the Lady knights him "Sir Bonehead" and dismisses him from her sight, none too fondly. Geralt can then still speak with her, he can even backtrack on the grail quest, but no sex. And she tells him so, saying "you know not how much you have lost". So don't blow it!Elf Woman[]To initiate the sexual encounter, Geralt must give food of some kind to the sorceress in the Elven cave after completing the Daily Bread quest. She is quite combative in her attitude, but apparently that excites her too.Villager[]Obtain a sugardoll and give it to the one who asks for something sweet. But first, you should obtain or make a perfume and present it to one of the village girls who wants to bewitch her boy. And then one of the girls will tell you that she likes it, leading to sex.
