The purpose of this document is to outline the process and requirements for obtaining a Swiss birth certificate, including its uses and how to replace it if lost or stolen. The international extract from record of birth (CIEC) is issued in four languages, with English and Spanish translations, while the national birth certificate is also available in these languages. The document serves as proof of parentage for unmarried parents and is required for foreign nationals to register their child with their native country's representation. It can also be presented to employers for child benefits applications. Any person concerned, parents of an underage child, legal representatives, or adults are entitled to obtain the document. The registry office issues the certificate at a cost of CHF 30.00 (+ postage) in Switzerland, with family certificates and other records costing more. The birth certificate is an important part of having a baby in Switzerland and serves as a crucial document for administrative purposes. The process is automatic, but it's essential to know its uses and how to replace a lost or stolen certificate. To obtain a birth certificate from the Swiss authorities, you must provide identification and an address to send the document to. If you're ordering for someone else, you'll need power of attorney and a copy of their ID, unless it's for your children under 18. Pay all applicable fees. To find the correct registry office in your area, visit the government website (or search online. The eligibility criteria for obtaining a birth certificate are not specified, but you can expect to pay CHF 30 (plus postage) for the document. The validity of a birth certificate is not stated, but it's mentioned that it's valid "forever". Documents required include proof of identity and address, which may vary depending on your situation. Sample completed documents and processing times are not provided, but you can expect to receive instructions from the civil register office in your place of birth. Required information for obtaining a birth certificate includes the date of birth, city or county of birth, and other personal details. A birth certificate is essential for various purposes, such as marriage, naturalization, adoption, and identity verification when crossing borders. Other uses of a birth certificate include proof of identity, enrollment in school, and family allowance. It's also necessary to register the birth of a child abroad with the Swiss authorities if you're a Swiss citizen or have close ties with Switzerland. If a person's birth is not registered with Swiss authorities before their 25th birthday and they hold another nationality, it can create complications. To prevent this, individuals should inform the relevant Swiss authorities - either through the embassy or consulate in their country of residence, or by contacting the local civil register office where the child was born.
